



Botanical name: Buckingham
celsissima

Common name: Ivory Curl Tree

Family: Proteaceae

Origin: Nth Qld, Australia

Habit: Small tree to large tree

Height: 8mtrs x 1-4mts (25mtrs in the bush)

Flowers: Produces white cream racemes of flowers on branch tips depending on the weather spring through summer however it will not flower in excessive humidity and rain

Leaves: Evergreen dense variable dark green leaves with a silver or red tip (depending on the time of year).



Climate: Sub-tropical, Warm temperate

Soil: Well-drained acid to neutral moist soil

Aspect: Full sun/Light shade

Care:

Prune: Tip prune after flowering if you want to maintain size. Pruning off spent flowers will trigger a flush of new vegetative growth and even more flowers next year

Drought/Frost: Moderate/Light frost tolerant

NOTE: Bees, nectar eating bird attracting.
