Botanical Name: Rhinacanthus

beesianus

Common Name: Chinese Snake

Jasmine

Origin: Yunnan Province China

Height/Width: 2m tall +

Habit: Shrub

Flower: Large heads of delicately perfumed white flowers shaped like scalloped shells. Blooming from March or April through the Autumn to early Winter months

Leaves: Large egg-

shaped leaf with the narrower end at the base, pleated and

shiny.

Climate: Tropical to temperate

Soil: .Grows in most soils.

Aspect. Flowers best in full sun but can cope in semi-shade. Grows well where

shrubby salvias would grow.

Prune: Hard prune mid-August to keep it shapely and feed with general-purpose

fertiliser then.

Drought/Frost: Tender

Propagation: Seeds and cuttings.
