



Common Name: Ruellia chartacea
Common Name: Red Shrimp Plant,
Peruvian Wild Petunia, Lobster Claw
Origin: Tropical forests of the South
American countries of Ecuador,
Columbia, Brazil and Peru
Height/Width: 2 m x 1m
Habit: Evergreen shrub
Flower: Terminal inflorescences,
formed by showy bright red bracts
that persist for many months.
Flowers are orange-red tubular with
yellow throats within the bracts

**Leaves:** Elliptic to lanceolate with a distinct sharp tip, dark green on the upper surface and a paler green below.

**Climate:** Tropical to temperate **Soil:** .Well drained sub-acid to

neutral

**Aspect:** Shady humid positions **Prune:** Prune hard after flowering.

**Drought/Frost:** Frost tender **Propagation:** Cuttings and seeds
