What's Happening in Your Garden:

Combo with Q & A:

Annette Rassow asked for recommendations for long handle pruners. Brands such as Stihl & Huskvarna were mentioned. Also battery powers rather than petrol power as battery lighter. Suggested visiting Johns (sells Stihls) or Steve's Mowers in Ballina? Sorry I forget which one was mentioned.

New member Anthony Hillin asked about the best garden edging to keep Kikuyu and Couch out of garden beds. One suggestion was a power edger as used by Jan in Eureka. Some just whipper snip. David Williamson has 150mm wide heavy weathering steel fabricated, which gives a nice clean line, but price implication. Steven Wedd uses rolls of plastic edging from Bunnings. Anthony also asked about the success of natural herbicides which didn't really get an answer.

Flora of the Month:

Margaret Bruce introduced Flora of the Month.

- Hazel Sowerby Farfugium japonicum 'Giganteum', a member of the Asteraceae (Daisy) family and native of Japan. Also called Leopard Plant. Likes semi to full shade, does best in with constant moisture in the soil. Evergreen perennial to 300mm spreads slowly by rhizome.
- Beth Noble pink camellia, Russelia equisiformis, firecracker plant, native to Mexico. Weeping fine leafed habit with narrow tubular flowers, usually red, but also orange and yellow cultivars. A ginger.

- Steven Wedd a large red Anthurium which gives a pop of colour under his large fig tree. A stunning flower/bract of a bromeliad, Guzmania wittmacki.
- Carol Lea popcorn dwarf daisies, assorted chrysantemuns oranges, pinks, green (Carol especially likes the green flowered versions) and yellows
- Anthony Hillin heritage roses, which he buys bare rooted. R. 'Showpiece Berry', R. floribunda 'Fairytale Magic', David Austen R. Abraham Darby and a Kordes rose.
- Margaret Bruce Iris japonicum, a species Iris.

Guest speaker:

Margaret Bruce introduced Shirley Boyle who will talk about her memories and the history of Bangalow.

Shirley showed us a wide range of photos and newspaper cuttings covering her life whole life living in Bangalow. Her father farmed using draft horses. In 1946 if your car could make it up Springvale Hill it was considered a good car. Being a large family the children were welcomed at Nashua School.

1st year of school they weekly boarded in Lismore. Shirley' father responsible for the bus company starting up a service so they could go to Lismore daily. The Rural Youth group was a thriving club, with young people cooking breeding cattle and showing at local shows etc.

Popular events in the area include dances held in the various halls, Saturady film nights in the A & I hall, Christmas Eve event.

1964 a huge tornado did a lot of damage. Some house were never seen again. The girls who worked on the local telephone exchange knew everyone's business.

The tradition was to leave work when you became married.

The Bangalow Bowling Club (since 1910? According to website), was originally hessian and tin cost 65 pounds. One they entered the shield competitions for instance it two days to get to Grafton.

Shirley's garden won Champion of Champion in the 2007 garden competition. Other memories include the torch relay going through Bangalow in 1965 and trips to Rocky Creek amongst many other stories.

Margaret tanked Shirley for her informative talk and presented Shirley with a deep red potted Chrysanthemum.
