Brian gave us a very entertaining talk with video about Neutrog, its history, Australian owned, what they do, academics doing R & D, involvement in food security, coffee waste goes into Human Beans product with proceeds from each sale going to feed the needy.

Neutrog researches soil biology, composts chicken manure, produces biological fertilisers, probiotics, soil conditioners and mulches which improve conditions for soil microbes, increases soil biome, improves root development, POPUL8 stops phytophthora soil fungal disease which affects Macadamias, Almonds, Kauri forests in WA. It aims to increase crop yields in broad scale farming. It has a relationship with gardeners, and uses photos of gardens in newsletters. Their products are used by high profile sites such as botanic gardens, race courses, parks etc.

Neutrog have products for crops, gardens, specific blends for flowering plants, native plants, roses, camellias, citrus, lawns.

Brian recommended feeding plants once each season i.e. 4 times a year. Best done in the morning or late afternoon as heat in the middle of the day as heat reduces the products effectiveness.
